#### REFLECTION

This liturgical feast has been on the church calendar for about one hundred years, often on different dates. It is a "devotional" or "idea" feast that inaugurated by Holy Family associations. Everything we know about the Holy

Family, which is not much, comes from the Gospel accounts read over the three years. It celebrates the unity and love so evident in the family of Joseph, Mary and Jesus. On the surface the Gospel describes the fidelity of the parents to the Jewish custom of presenting their first born male child to the Lord. As they do this in respect to

the tradition, they encounter Simeon and Anna who represent that tradition and who acknowledge that new tradition is unfolding in the child Jesus. Their waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem is over; the hope of the past

## **RELIC OF ST. FRANCIS XAVIER**

A first– degree relic of missionary St. Francis Xavier is coming to the Archdiocese of Toronto, January 12 to 14, 2018. The forearm of the saint, permanently displayed at the Church of the Gesu in Rome, will be in Canada from Dec. 29 to Feb. 2, as part of a 14 city Canadian visit. In our archdiocese, the relic will be hosted by St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica (Jan. 12); St. Francis Xavier Church, Mississauga (Jan. 13); and Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Toronto (Jan. 14) More information about the visit and a full schedule of events can be found at: www.cco.ca/relic Organizers believe this is the first time the relic has been on Canadian soil. The body of St. Francis Xavier, which is buried in Goa, India, as well as the relic of his arm are incorrupt. They have not experienced natural decay since his death in 1552.
