REFLECTION

The Eucharistic celebration is the Christian Passover. Jesus is our Passover lamb and we are liberated from our sins. His blood, offered for us in sacrifice, makes us clean and renews the covenant God made with us long ago. Jesus gives a new interpretation to a traditional ritual meal, breaking the bread and sharing the cup as sacramental sign of the total gift of himself, which he offers on the cross for all people. In the first reading, we see how the people signify their acceptance of God's covenant, his promise to them. They submit to God, the creator of all things, by offering sacrifice; their common sharing of the offerings by eating of them establishes their unity. Moses sprinkles blood on them to signify of the old covenant, the letter to the Hebrews tells us, were only outward signs of repentance. Jesus' perfect self-offering has the power to transform us inwardly. We can look forward to the fulfillment of God's promise, when we will drink the new wine with our savior in God's kingdom. (Sunday Mass Book)

BREIF HISTORY OF CORPUS CHRISTI

The history of this feast is inseparable from the social and political context of Belgium and medieval Eucharistic devotion and practices. In response to debates about the Real Presence and infrequent communion, there was a great development of Eucharistic devotion. The feast was established in 1246 in Liege, Belgium, by Bishop Robert of Turotte, in response to the call of Julianna of Cornillon and Eve of St. Martin. In 1208 Julianna reported a vision through which she understood that Jesus lamented the absence of a particular feast in the Church's calendar focused on his sacramental presence on the altar. Her vision launched a campaign which led to the establishment of the Feast of Corpus Christi. (The New Catholic Encyclopedia)
